OUR NEW PARKING LOT

On May 18th, the Congregation, at the annual meeting, approved the project to repave the parking lot and provide storm water abatement provisions. The committee is working with our engineering consultants and the contractor to finalize the contract. It appears likely that work will commence on or about June 16th. The entrance to the west parking lot next to the church building off of Glenview Road will be immediately closed to begin work on the storm water retention segment of the project. This access will likely be closed for three to four weeks.

In the meantime please use the north lot for parking at the church. There will still be access to the west entrance to the building from there. On Sundays, you can park in the west lot and we will have access to the west entrance from there.

Later in the summer, we will be repaying the west and north parking lots, with the work going on during the work week. We will still have parking available on Sundays.
