

GIFTS MOST RARE

As I write my first Broadcaster article of 2015, I am filled with gratitude for your faithful and generous support of the message, ministries and mission of the Glenview Community Church.

In 2014, your response to challenges to go above and beyond your already generous support for GCC has been nothing less than phenomenal! For our parking lot and drainage system campaign **Asphalt and Drains**, **Oh My!** (over \$100,000)...for the **Heifer International Living Gift Market** (nearly \$7,000)...for olive trees for the peacemaking ministry of **Tent of Nations** in the West Bank (over \$1,000)...for **Feed My Starving Children...**for **A Just Harvest...**for **Hands of Peace...**for **Matanya's Hope...**and for so many other ministries you have made joyful stewardship come alive at GCC.

But, first and foremost, your vital stewardship is also obvious in your financial support of the ongoing life of the Glenview Community Church. Utility bills...insurance bills... staff salaries...office and cleaning supplies...computers and copy machines don't provide much motivation for giving. But without funding for these mundane physical expenses, GCC would not be equipped to be a transforming spiritual community for our congregation and beyond. And in this basic financial support of GCC's ongoing life you have excelled!

At the Mid-Winter Congregational meeting last February, you approved a budget that included a transfer from our unrestricted reserves for two purposes: \$131,564 for operating expenses and \$60,000 to the Capital Reserve. The amount of unrestricted

reserve dollars that was actually used to support our ongoing operating expenses was \$102,000, or \$29,000 less than budgeted! And we did this in the year when we began providing health insurance for our full-time lay staff members and when we experienced a significant increase in our property insurance cost to secure flood insurance after our previous carrier cancelled that coverage. What amazing giving!

But 2014 is in the books. As God leads us forward, we must now build on what has been by focusing on what shall be. Our Stewardship Board has led us in an inspiring campaign to support the message, ministries and mission of GCC in 2015. Who doesn't know that we are **Blessed to be a Blessing**? As of this writing, our financial commitments for 2015 total \$922,000. Let me put that in perspective. In 2013 our stewardship campaign reached a modern low of \$811,000. That means that our campaign for 2015 already exceeds the campaign of two years ago by \$111,000. That's good news! But for GCC to become financially sustainable, we need to fulfill our goal of \$1,100,000. In order to reach that goal, I have encouraged the Stewardship Board to conduct a second mile campaign in this season of Epiphany...the season of light. Here is the campaign:


