

Pilgrims Progress

Having moved into a new year, we are moving into the unknown. Perhaps revisiting Abraham's story will help us as we go forward in 2010, not knowing where our journey will take us this year but confident of the God who guides us as Abraham was confident in his day.

The storyteller summarizes Abraham's life with this line, "Then he moved on from place to place, going toward the southern part of Canaan" (Gen. 12:9). Abraham and his family became nomads, people who would put up their tents for a season, then take them down, and move to another place. After Abraham started listening to God, he never again knew a settled life.

This is characteristic of the seeker's life. Abraham searched for a place, found a place, settled for a season, only to uproot and seek another place. Seeking a place became a life-long journey for Abraham.

Perhaps the theme song for Abraham and his family was, "On the Road Again." Neither Abraham nor his descendants considered the wandering a blessing. They didn't like the struggles and the changes and living in a state of having not yet arrived any more than we do.

But what if the blessing weren't the land at all? Maybe we've been missing the point all these years. What if the land was a metaphor for something more important than being able to call a piece of land your own, to build a house on it and keep a family there from generation to generation? What if the blessing was not the land but the relationship itself? The moment Abraham walked out of the house in Haran he began a journey that put him into a covenant-relationship with God. Centuries later when Moses died on the East Side of the Jordan looking over into Canaan, no bitterness or remorse is evident in his life. Maybe the Promised Land is not about geography but about relationships, relationships with God and with fellow human beings, a place to be.

Have you ever had the notion that some day your life would be settled? I have, but I am finally permitting that illusive dream to die. When I was in high school, I was eager for college. That would be real life. In college, I was eager to get on to seminary and make preparation for my vocation. I was eager to finish seminary so I could get on with real ministry. Having been a pastor now for more than forty-three years, I have not found life to be settled by any means.

Maybe all of us are nomads, pitching our tents first here and then there. We camp out at a committee meeting, a worship service, at our jobs, at school, drop by the house for bite of food and nap, and we're off again moving from place to place going toward the southern part of the Promised Land wherever and whatever that is.

Relationships are for a lifetime. They change because life is constantly changing. Abraham's worldview changed because his covenant relationship with God caused him to redefine his world. Abraham's life from the time he left Haran was much harder and much better than he ever imagined possible. Has this been true of your relationship with God? Ever since you got involved with God has your life been unsettled, moving from place to place, emotionally if not also geographically? The blessing is the relationship, and it contains both threat and promise. The threat is that we will be changed. The promise is that we will be changed.

As we journey in relationship with God, it becomes clearer that to live our lives on God's terms is to live a nomadic existence, moving from place to place. The only thing settled in our lives in the relationship with God is how unsettled our lives are. Relationships are for a lifetime and they are forever changing. The blessing from God is not the settled place but the relationship.
