MID-WINTER CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

The congregation of Glenview Community Church met immediately following worship on Sunday, February 26th and made several important decisions for the life of our church.

ELECTIONS

At the recommendation of the Leadership Committee and the Spiritual Council, we unanimously elected **Cathy Shapiro** as Church Clerk and **Chris Clark** as Church Treasurer. This is a significant transition that replaces two dedicated leaders at GCC. **Bob McGee** was elected Church Clerk in 2011 and served in that position for six years. **David Aki** was elected Vice-Moderator in 2011 and served in that capacity, then as Moderator and Past Moderator. Immediately following the completion of his term as Past Moderator, Dave was elected Church Treasurer in 2014. How blessed we are by Bob's and Dave's devotion to the Message, Ministries and Mission of GCC!

MONEY FOR THE CHURCH'S MINISTRY

Stewardship Board chair **Steve Hill** presented a report concerning our annual appeal for the Message, Ministries and Mission of GCC in 2017. After much diligent work, the pledge total presently stands at \$845,000, or

\$200,000 **less** than is necessary to sustain our church in strength in 2017. With the help of an excellent Powerpoint presentation, Moderator **Nancy Mullarkey** helped us better understand GCC's monetary needs for 2017. She also presented the results of a survey she has conducted of churches similar to ours in similar Chicago-area communities. That survey reveals that GCC has the lowest average and median pledge of all the churches that participated in the survey.

While that news may be received as discouraging, Nancy urged us to receive it as hopeful. We are not even close to our maximum giving capacity, which means that we have a great deal of room to grow in our stewardship! After the presentation, the congregation voted to postpone action on a 2017 budget for GCC to the Annual Meeting on May 21st in order to give the congregation the time it needs to generously respond to GCC's financial needs. This Stewardship Board led effort will challenge us all to increase our pledges. Please plan to prayerfully and faithfully respond when you are invited to do so!
