

WE'RE STILL HERE Showing up is 80 percent of life. Marshall Brickman

Recently we asked four vendors to provide GCC with a service proposal. Only one showed up. Doug – my newly-retired seminary classmate and friend – has been busy upgrading his house. He contracted with a big box retailer to install new carpet. The installation was scheduled three times, and three times the installers failed to show up on time or to show up at all. **Showing up is 80 percent of life.** And Marshall Brickman's 80 percent estimate may well be low!

No matter how skilled, gifted and talented a person is, all of those superlatives are diminished without dependability, dedication, persistence, constancy, and reliability... without showing up. And showing up isn't just essential for our jobs and careers. It matters every bit as much for spouses, parents, friends, community service, commitments, and participation in community organizations, including church. As two old clichés say it: Talk is cheap! and Put **vour money where your mouth is!** In other words, even when we don't feel like it... even when it's inconvenient...even when something more enticing comes along, **Show up!** Very simply, **showing up** is about

This year, **showing up** is the theme of GCC's **Concert for Peace.** A number of Januaries ago at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Celebration in the Wisconsin State Capitol Rotunda, one of the grand ladies from the civil rights movement spoke. This is what she said:

We're still here. We're still here! We're still here!!!

Then she began to sing a beautiful freedom song about the unfailing goodness of our God. What a message of persistence, determination, and the joy of constancy! It was

an unforgettable moment.

Concert for Peace is one of the great undiscovered treasures of GCC. It sets the words and spirit of peace to music and song. It is moving. It is inspiring. It is elevating. It is motivating! And it is interfaith. Muslims, Jews and Christians will come together in this concert to embrace and extend our common longing for peace. In addition this year, art will join music in the expression of peace as our friend Pat Albano from Aaron Galleries right here in Glenview curates an exhibit of peace-themed artistic works. And a freewill offering will benefit *Hands of Peace*. Thank you, Katherine Hughes, for creating this concert and for making it happen each year!

This amazing blessing can be yours on Sunday, March 19 at 3:00 p.m. in the GCC sanctuary. So my encouragement to you is to put it on your calendar. Make a commitment to be there. Bring your family members and friends. Or, more succinctly, **show up!** Yes, 80 percent of the work of peace is showing up. Showing up says **We're Still Here!**

And that's my same pastoral urging for you for every time the church gathers. So much of our values have to do with habit. And, so many times, what we do by habit becomes a precious blessing that would have never touched our hearts or enriched our lives if we hadn't shown up. March 19th at 3 pm. Every Sunday morning at 10 am. And special events in addition and in between. Remember, showing up is at least 80 percent of life. So **show up**: for yourself...and, most of all, for God! And I'll see you in church!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT - FEBRUARY 28

Those of us who walk along this road do so reluctantly.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Nancy Mullarkey, after which Pastor Chuck Mize led us in an opening prayer.

Stewardship Gap. The Council members broke up into small groups and spent 45 minutes developing an action plan to close the \$275,000 shortfall in this year's pledge target of \$1.125 million by the Annual Meeting on May 21. Clergy, church officers and the Spiritual Council are committed to rolling out this plan promptly. The congregation will be challenged to engage in providing the financial resources needed to sustain and support the message, ministries and mission of GCC that we have come to expect. Voting on the 2017 church budget has been deferred until the Annual Meeting.

Highlights of the Pastors' Reports. Pam Keckler reviewed the recent successful visit by UCC President and General Minister Rev. John Dorhauer and the work of our 8th grade confirmands as they prepare for confirmation later this spring. She also announced upcoming Lenten programs, including the Women's Retreat (March 10-12), Book Study Groups (When Breath Becomes Air, by Paul Kalanithi), Bible Study on Jesus' Parables (Wednesdays at 3 p.m.), Boy Scout Pancake Breakfast (March 12), New Member Breakfast (March 19), Peace Concert (March 19), Holy Week Seder, and Children's Musical (Good Friday evening).

Elizabeth Hartung Ciccolini discussed the annual planning meeting held with the

church school teachers and also summarized the regular weekly activities of each group to whom she ministers: 678 Club & POW (Wednesday night fellowship-26 attending), FISH (Wednesday grade school children's program-12 to 18 attending), PYF (Sundays-25 attending), and 12th grade Dinners (Thursdays).

During Chuck Mize's recent two weeks in Florida he met with several GCC members in Naples. He also summarized the upcoming Lenten programs enumerated above.

Committee Reports. The chair, Bob Mc-Gee, and members of the Governance Task Force, Debby Fosdick and Shane Bill, gave a 45-minute presentation on the proposed new plan of governance for GCC, including a proposed transition plan and interim Constitution and Bylaws. The purpose of the new governance plan is to simplify the structure of our church governance by reducing the number of elected positions and encouraging more voluntary participation to better carry out GCC's message, ministries and mission. Three educational meetings are scheduled for Sundays during March and a congregational vote on the plan will be held at the Annual Meeting on May 21. Vice Moderator Gretchen Grad discussed the work which the Leadership Committee will undertake to identify and nominate individuals for the five Ministries which will replace the existing 13 Boards under the proposed plan.

Gretchen also reported that Rev. John Dorhauer and a group of UCC leaders recently returned from a visit to Israel/Palestine during which they met with the Hands of Peace Middle East Regional Managers.

Construction Committee chair Nick Peters reported on the progress which his committee is making toward rationalizing the former \$8 million Phase One design concept of the TKWA Architects to accommodate our current budget of \$3.6 million.

Church Employee Healthcare Policy. Past Moderator and PMRC chair Doug Morgan introduced a proposal to modify the healthcare insurance coverage of lay employees. Going forward these employees and their current dependents will continue to be cov-

ered by the church, but any dependents of new employees or additional dependents of current employees will be the responsibility of the employee. After discussion, the proposal was approved.

Pastor Elizabeth led us with a closing prayer and the Lord's Prayer.



Presidential Executive Orders during the past month have put policies into place that destroy the current USA refugee resettlement program. Travel and visa bans affect the safety of some of the most vulnerable groups in the world and those assigned for resettlement in our nation. Cutting in half the total number of refugees allowed for resettlement also means that funding support for those already in the US is lost. This is our time to exercise our faith commitments of welcome and we'll-being.

You Can Act Now:

- 1. Personally support refugees present in the US now through local Church World Service resettlement offices.
- 2. Add your voice for welcome. Participate in the advocacy campaign #WeAreAllAmericans. Call your national legislators daily. Contact your state and local elected officials. Engagement Toolkit and other resources available from #GreaterAs1.
- 3. Educate your UCC conferences, congregations and all constituents by sharing the "Ecumenical Declaration to Protect Welcome and Restore Hope" released March 3, 2017 by the National Council of Churches and Church World Service.
- 4. Connect with UCC National Collaborative on Immigration related to intersections with movements against anti-immigrant actions. The recording of the March 2 webinar, "Welcoming Immigrants in the Trump Era," related to the New Sanctuary Movement is available. Please contact Rev.
