

# **BEING HERE**

It's not been easy to be at GCC. The core of the building is a construction zone. The initial excitement of a crane soaring over GCC turned into "When is the crane going away?" The circle drive at our grand entrance is blocked by a staging area with a chain link fence...holes for a new water service and storm drainage crater our lawn and gardens...there are only two functional rest rooms...we lose our way as we navigate the basement from the office to the sanctuary. And then there is the omnipresent, unending and insidious dust! In spite of it all, we have advanced our many ministries with surprisingly little compromise. It's frustrating, sometimes maddening, because of unexpected limitations and disruptions. Our professionals from TKWA (our architects), Altounian Construction (our general contractor) and The AT Group (our owner's representative) truly are a dream team. They demonstrate every day how much they care about GCC, work together incredibly well, and have become good friends. But it's the members of our staff who are our true heroes! They have carried on with an amazing can-do spirit. It's impossible to tell you how much extra work our staff has done behind the scenes so that our members and friends experience as few interruptions as possible. We are abundantly blessed!

And I'm grateful to all of you for hanging in there. We knew at the outset that it wasn't going to be easy to be at GCC through this process, and it hasn't been. However, one day soon, it will be very exciting to be at GCC. We will be welcomed by a gracious, inviting, accessible, functional space that will support our ministries in ways we never dreamed of.

The inconveniences of this project may have made being here difficult. But there are other places where it's far more difficult to be: in Chicago neighborhoods where the warming temperatures of spring make violence and murder bloom with the flowers... in hospitals and homes where friends and loved ones struggle with disease and are grieved by death...in our own minds and hearts where we wrestle with disappointments, and challenges, and depression, and heartbreaks.

Now Holy Week is upon us. It takes us to places where we don't want to be: to an upper room where Jesus transformed a Passover meal for twelve into an intimate experience of His saving love...to the chief priest's courtyard where Peter insisted that he never knew Jesus...to the Praetorium where Pilate condemned Jesus...to the cross where only a handful of Jesus' most devoted disciples dared to keep vigil at His crucifixion...to the tomb where that faithful handful laid his body...to Easter morning where the women who loved Jesus discovered the best news of all time: He is not **here.** He is risen! This good news teaches us that, in all of these places where it's hard to be, Jesus is there.

Being here isn't easy. But that's true of most places and processes that truly make a difference...that reach deep into our hearts. If you haven't been at GCC for a while, there's no better time to come back and be here than now! Construction will soon be done. Pardon our dust and find your way into the building now...because Jesus is here! See you in church!

## **SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MTG REPORT MARCH 19, 2019**

The March Spiritual Council meeting revolved around discussions about outreach and construction.

## **CONSTRUCTION UPDATE:**

It is looking less likely that all our new spaces will be open by Easter, but our contractor is confident that construction will be completed by the end of the program year.

## **ORGAN CLEANING:**

Recently, it has been discovered that construction has caused a significant amount of dust to build up inside our beautiful organ. This is an urgent matter because construction dust, being made of limestone particles, is especially corrosive and poses a real risk of damage. After gathering estimates, it has been determined that the cost of cleaning the organ will be around \$164,000, including around \$11,000 in upgrades that will help increase the organ's lifespan. For context, organs generally need to be cleaned every 20–40 years, and our organ is 20 years old. The first step in the cleaning can begin right away, as the ranks of reed pipes will be removed from the sanctuary and cleaned at the organ builder's workshop while construction is completed. This expense will not affect the annual budget. More detailed information will be provided to the congregation in as timely a manner as possible about the organ cleaning and all the decision-making processes it involves.

#### **OUTREACH:**

The Outreach Ministry presented its Outreach Summary for 2018, which lists GCC's donations of money, time, and goods for the year. The totals are impressive, including almost \$140,000 in monetary donations and at least 1,376 service hours. Among other highlights: GCC youth provided 200 hygiene kits, 124 snack packs, and 24 Christmas stockings to **The Night Ministry** in the fall; the Women's Association provided 461 **Dunkin Donuts** cards to **The Night Ministry** in December; and 260 GCC members volunteered at **A Just Harvest**.
