CONGREGATIONAL SIZE AND CHARACTERISTICS

A fascinating area of interest to me is how the characteristics of a congregation are affected by its size. I believe we would agree that the larger the congregation, the greater can be the number and size of its various programs, given that they can receive the staff and fiscal support necessary for them to operate effectively. I believe we would also agree that the larger the congregation, the greater the challenge it faces in engaging and maintaining interactions among people and programs. As a large congregation, we have to be constantly mindful of this challenge as we bring in new members, retrieve members who have become inactive, and retain our members.

In his book, "Sizing Up a Congregation for New Member Ministry," Arlin J. Rothauge describes characteristics of four types of churches based on congregation size, as below:

- The Family Church, with fewer than 50 average attendance at worship, is bound together by emotional ties and a feeling of belonging. It has little anonymity, does little planning, and manages itself by "knowing who to talk to."
- The Pastoral Church, with 50-150 average attendance at worship, is usually bound together by two or three subgroups, with the minister as the hub and involved in almost everything. More people are involved in decision-making than the other three types of churches. Membership inclusion is more easily gained than in the Family Church.
- The Program Church, with 150-350 average attendance at worship, has less unity than the Family Church or the Pastoral Church. Its operation is dependent on the work of boards and committees, and highlighted by delegation of responsibilities. Its ministerial staff has greater

management responsibilities. Its new members tend to join part of the church (entry and assimilation occur in a subgroup); otherwise, they can find entry into the life of the congregation difficult unless guided and supported by "involved" members.

• The Corporate Church, with more than 350 average attendance at worship, embraces effective preaching, the credentials of its leaders, the extent and quality of its facilities, and its reputation in the denomination and community. Its authority is more concentrated. Its senior minister is its symbol of unity, but knows relatively fewer people than occurs in the other three types of churches. This church is more venturesome, and its programs, services, and classes are more diverse than the other three types of churches. Again, its new members tend to join part of the church (entry and assimilation occur in a subgroup); otherwise, they can find entry into the life of the congregation difficult unless guided and supported by "involved" members.

Over the past few years, GCC has experienced substantial declines in attendance at worship and in active membership. Whether we consider it a Program Church or a Corporate Church, GCC is operating guite effectively as a community of faith, in serving its members and the community. Now as we initiate an intensive three-part program - to bring in new members, retrieve members who have become inactive, and retain our members - we will have to make every effort to be an outwardly welcoming and inwardly supporting congregation, where opportunities to receive and serve in the true love of Christian fellowship abound.
