DIVINE WORSHIP

We have all been touched by the horror at the Boston Marathon and the fertilizer plant explosion in Texas. And we likely know people whose lives have been severely affected by the flooding rains that so recently deluged the Chicago metropolitan area and washed over the floors of the lower level of the Glenview Community Church with as much as two inches of water. Because of this context of disruption and devastation I want to say a word to you about what I believe are the meaning and importance of corporate worship for us as we seek to serve God and follow Jesus Christ.

There was once a day when it was common for churches of our tradition to call the gathering of the church community on Sunday morning divine worship or meeting. We seldom refer to our time together as meeting, while worship no longer has divine attached to it. But, along the way, we have accumulated other names for this community event: service, celebration and praise. Often the focus is on the front, on the leaders. If it was a secular event, we'd call them performers. In this expression the congregation is little more than an audience. In the 19th century, Henry Ward Beecher (an entertainer if there ever was one!) emphasized worship as entertainment when he replaced the pews with theater seats at Plymouth Congregational Church in Brooklyn; the church whose pulpit he dramatically occupied each week.

Nevertheless, our worship tradition is not passive entertainment. To the contrary it is one of active congregational participation. And I believe that is crucial because worship sets our lives in the context of our relationship with God and, through God, with each other. It is also crucial because I am convinced that worship is the center of every congregation that is vital, responsive and alive. But what is it? What is worship?

For me, worship has at least six essential components.

FIRST, worship encounters the Holy. As one person commented to me years ago: I feel like I've just spent an hour in heaven. That is a tall order! But worship can bring us into the very presence of God.

SECOND, worship praises God. That's why worship can never be performance or entertainment. The focus of performance and entertainment is on us. But the focus of worship is on God. That means that worship is ministry because, at its core, ministry means minus. It means making less of ourselves and making more of God. Worship gets us out of the way so that we can become who God calls us to be.

THIRD, worship transforms the mind. Worship focuses on God's word. And, in the Greek of the New Testament, word and logic are synonyms. Worship opens Holy Scripture and illuminates it to reveal the word...the logic...of our God. If that happens in worship, our minds can't help but be transformed.

FOURTH, worship moves the heart. Martin Luther's crest – and now the crest of the Lutheran Church - is the Luther Rose. At its center is a heart. Just so, John Calvin's symbol for the Christian faith was a heart aflame. The Christian faith isn't just an idea to consider. It is committed devotion to the love of God in Jesus Christ. As John says it with such profound simplicity, God is love. When our hearts are moved, the Christian faith gets inside us...in our bones. When that happens, we are forever devoted to God and to all of God's children.

FIFTH, worship inspires discipleship. That means that worship makes us want to folcontinued on page 2

In the words that Andrew Young used for the title of his spiritual memoir, hope means that God will make for us A Way Out of No Way. Hope is what painted the rainbow after the flood. Hope is what led Israel through the Red Sea from slavery to freedom. And, most magnificently, hope is what turned Jesus' agony and death on the cross into resurrection and new life.

So every Sunday...the first day of the week...the day of the resurrection, we gather to worship our God. We gather to become the body of Christ in the world today. We gather to be filled with an animated by the Holy Spirit so that we can follow Jesus. I pray every week that our worship will be all of these things, and more. Please let me know if these hallmarks are your experience. And come! If you have a familiar place in a GCC pew, don't let it get cold. And, if you haven't found your way to GCC on a Sunday recently, there's room for you.

Friends, being Christian means sharing God's gifts of faith, hope and love; with one another and with our world. Join us as we do that, each Sunday. See you in church!
