I find a certain comfort in discovering others suffer from the same malady I do. What the malady is does not matter. What matters is that someone else is in as bad a shape as I am. This comfort zone mentality cuts across all areas of life. If I have difficulty dealing with one of our children, I'm comforted knowing someone else is having similar struggles. "I may not be perfect but they aren't either."

Lately, I have noticed I suffer from a lack of patience more than used to be the situation for me. I wonder if there is a correlation between my age and this issue. However, my observations through the years had been that as people got older they seemed to be more patient with trying circumstances, not less. Then, I was introduced to David Shenk's new book, The End of Patience. I read about myself as he mentioned the frustration that people experience and express as they sit at their computers and have to wait for the search engine to bring up the information.

Shenk says it best so let me quote extensively from page 41 of his book.

"Tell me: How slow is your computer modem? Are you still crawling around with a 2400 baud? Or are you puttering along with a 9600? Perhaps you have a 14.4, which for a while seemed fast-until you saw someone else's 28.8 shoveling data twice as quickly. Don't envy your 28.8 friend too much, though-his other pal just bought a 56K. The guy with the 56K modem logs on to the Net and starts drooling when he sees an advertisement for 128K. Does this ever end?

"What if I told you there's no such thing as a fast modem, and there never will be? That's because quickness has disappeared from our culture. We now only experience degrees of slowness. With conveniences like the fax machine, email, FedEx, beepers, and so on, we've managed to compress time to such an extent that we're now painfully aware of every second that we wait for anything. Did you ever ride in an elevator with someone so impatient, the person just kept smacking one of the floor buttons over and



over? We've all become that person, a culture of restless button smackers. The other day I was in a McDonald's that had just introduced the guaranteed-ninety-second lunch. Now that's fast-food. But do you think that people won't be tapping their fingers on the counter, rolling their eyes, even looking at their watches? If you're in that button-smacking frame of mind, ninety seconds can seem like an eternity.

"So it goes with technology. As we speed it up, we also speed up our expectations... ..the only way to avoid becoming a button smacker is to somehow come to terms with the waiting. You stop losing the un-winnable rat race as soon as you decide to stop running it."

Come to terms with waiting. I wonder if I can do that. How can I do that? I'll explore my struggle with waiting next week.


