

A SPIRIT OF...

Through its Message, Ministries and Mission, the Glenview Community Church is making God's love real in healing, comforting, challenging and transforming ways. Our challenge is to do that with dynamic relevance in a changing world, replacing the seductive temptation of the seven last words of the church – We've never done it that way before! – with the saving truth of the gospel – Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever.

One of the tools that help us interpret and embrace the good news of God's love at GCC is an annual theme. Two years ago that theme was A Living Church: a theme that helped us emphasize and strengthen the vitality of our congregation. Last year, our theme was A House for ALL God's People: a theme that reminds us that, in Jesus, God loves, welcomes and includes everyone. As we've used this theme for the past year, it's become clear to many of us that A House for ALL God's People is too central to our message, ministries and mission to put it on the shelf. So we will continue to use it as GCC's identity tag-line for the foreseeable future.

So what will our theme be this year? Traditional churches have been institutions that teach about God, support the secular community and do benevolent work. But what they often miss is spirituality; the deep desire for a connection to a power greater than ourselves that we feel deep in our bones...a power that fills us with meaning, purpose and vitality...a power that doesn't depend on empty rituals that we repeat because we're afraid that God will punish us if we don't. This is why so many are saying, "I'm spiritual, not religious." Spirituality is a quest that fills our minds and our hearts

with meaning, purpose and vitality.

So how can we set the church free from institutional rigidity and make its religion an inspiring expression of God's love? I believe that GCC is already on that journey. In my own life and in my time with you, I have been blessed by spirituality in the faith community of the church. Just as the Holy Spirit came to Jesus' disciples gathered together on the first Pentecost, so the Holy Spirit still comes to us when even two or three of us are gathered together in Jesus' name. Too often the Holy Spirit sounds mysterious, fuzzy and ethereal. But it's not. This Holy Spirit is the presence and power of God's love as we know it in Jesus: nothing more, and nothing less.

The theme for our coming year together is this: **A Spirit of...** This theme will help us to focus on the things of the Spirit. It is grounded in these words of the Apostle Paul to the Galatian Christians:

...the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things.

So, as we begin our year in September, our focus will be *A Spirit of Faithfulness*. In October, our focus will be *A Spirit of Kindness*. In November as we pledge our financial support to the Message, Ministries and Mission of GCC in 2016, our focus will be *A Spirit of Generosity*. As we prepare to receive the gift of God's love in human flesh in Advent, our focus will be *A Spirit of Patience*. Christmas and Christmastide will be filled with *A Spirit of Joy*. In Epiphany, and as we remember Dr. Martin Luther King,

Jr., our focus will be A Spirit of Gentleness. Our Lenten journey will be anchored by A Spirit of Self-Control. Rejoicing in the victory of the resurrection, we will focus on A Spirit of Love in Easter and Eastertide. And, in May, our focus will be A Spirit of Peace. One of God's great serendipitous, spiritual blessings for GCC is the homecoming of the Rev. Dr. Bobbie McKay, along with her husband, Lew Musil. Bobbie served GCC as the Women's Association pastor from 1970-1979. In these intervening 35 years, Bobbie and Lew have done remarkable research into the spiritual life of congregations of our United Church of Christ, other mainline denominations and religious communities. Through this process, Bobbie has developed a Spiritual Life Team ministry that helps us to better connect to God and to make God more real in our lives. Meeting monthly for 90 minutes, these small groups engage in conversation, reflection and prayer. I am thrilled that Bobbie has accepted my invitation to minister again at GCC as our Pastoral Associate for Spiritual Life, and that she will begin the Spiritual Life Team ministry at GCC this fall. DON CLARK TO RETIRE

On Friday, August 14th, our own Don Clark announced that he is retiring as General Counsel of the United Church of Christ on his birthday, November 26th. The only person to ever serve twice as the Moderator of Glenview Community Church, Don became involved with the United Church of Christ through his active leadership role at GCC. Thank you, Don, for your tenacious, devoted and excelling service to the United Church of Christ! Below is the announcement of Don's retirement from the United Church of Christ.

In his time as General Counsel for the United Church of Christ, Donald C. Clark never lost a case. After 25 years of service, representing the wider church in more than 30 different states in both federal and state court proceedings, Clark has announced his retirement. He will step down from his post on his birthday, Nov. 26.

"It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as legal counsel for this denomination," Clark said. "It has been the best job I ever had."

"I have a great family, including six grand-children, and I'll be looking for other ways to be of service to the church," Clark added. The Rev. John C. Dorhauer, UCC general minister and president, said the church owes Clark a huge debt of gratitude for his service.

"Few know how much our beloved denomi-

nation owes to Don Clark for our ongoing vitality and health," Dorhauer said. "He works without fanfare behind the scenes. I would argue that no one is more responsible for that vitality and health than Don himself. He is a brilliant legal advocate whose dogged defense of our covenant partners in legal matters both frivolous and substantial, combined with his deep love and passion for our mission, have made him a 21st century defender of the faith." Clark began his role as the first general counsel of the UCC in March 2013 after spending the previous decade as special counsel for the denomination. Since 2003, Clark has served as the UCC's primary legal counsel, advising the denomination on a range of issues, including the lawsuit General Synod of the UCC v. Reisinger the highly-publicized case filed by the UCC which found North Carolina's marriage laws unconstitutional and brought marriage equality to that state. The case marked the first time a major U.S. denomination challenged a state's ban on samegender marriage on First Amendment and equal protection grounds.


"I am privileged and humbled to have worked alongside Don," said Heather Kimmel, associate general counsel for the UCC. "His understanding of and love for the United Church of Christ transcend legal issues. His work has allowed our clergy and covenant partners to focus on what is truly important — doing good ministry." Clark also successfully represented the UCC during an IRS inquiry into whether thenpresidential candidate Barack Obama's appearance at General Synod 2007 jeopardized the denomination's tax-exempt status.

In 2014, Crain's Cleveland Business magazine presented Clark with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his work as the UCC's general counsel and he received an honorary doctorate from Chicago Theological Seminary.

Clark earned his bachelor's degree from Williams College and his law degree from Rutgers Camden Law School in 1979. He was a partner in two of Chicago's largest law firms (Isham, Lincoln & Beale, and McDermott, Will & Emery). He managed his own firm, Clark & DeGrande, before assuming his role with the UCC more than 12 years ago.

"He is going to be hard to replace. He is going to be dearly missed," Dorhauer said. "No words will adequately express my deep and profound gratitude to Don for his years of service to the United Church of Christ."

GCC IN CHICAGO'S PRIDE PARADE

"God loves you, Glenview!" was just one of the many shouts of appreciation 17 GCC marchers in Chicago's Pride Parade received along the route through Chicago's Lakeview neighborhood on June 28. The shout-out was in response to the message "God is Love" printed in rainbow colors on the T-shirts GCC's delegation wore. Three more GCC members cheered the group on and snapped photos from the parade sidelines.

The purpose of GCC's appearance in the 46th annual celebration of the LGBT community was to showcase the church as a true "House for ALL God's People." GCC shared the road with about 50 churches marching as part of the Chicago Coalition of Welcoming Churches, which led a prayer and worship service before the parade step-off. Kathie Wilson and daughter Brittany volunteered with the Coalition as parade marshals, keeping everyone moving safely.

GCC's contingent included three high school students and their parents. One of the teens commented that this was so much fun that all of PYF needs to share the joy next year. Church supporters who were unable to march sponsored the GCC's walkers by making contributions to the CRIB, a mission of the Night Ministry that provides shelter and support to homeless LGBT youth in Chicago.

MYRA LORIS IS BACK...WORLD WAR II

Myra Loris will continue her six-part lecture series on World War II on the following Tuesday evenings, starting with dessert at 7:00 p.m. Ms. Loris will begin at 7:30 p.m. and speak for an hour.

September 15: Casualties of Suspicion looks at how old prejudices and attitudes led to new excuses for bias and discrimination during the war years, both on the part of government and individuals. The Neisse Internment Camps, Anti-Semitism and Racism and saucy specifics such as segregation in the military, the anti Hispanic Zoot Suit Riots in LA, the role of the U.S. State Department in subverting the rescue of European Jews from the Death Camps and much, much more will be delved into.

October 13: *Hollywood Goes* to War looks at the role of government propaganda agencies, the media, stars of screen and stage, War Bond Drives, posters and slogans from the OWI and the vast and enormously successful social and cultural apparatus that was called into service both to raise morale and money during the war. Lots of great data and also lots of fun!

November 10: Last Hired First Fired looks at the essential and unique role of American women during the war, their contributions and their concerns, at the GI Bill, and summarizes the political, economic and social consequences that left the nation forever changed by the war's end.
