In worship we received Ellen Dean, Matt Kiefer, Wayne and Marguerite Lueptow, Amy Terpstra Opensky, Libby and Ryan Peschke, Terrie Schaeffer, Donna Scott and Jodelyn and Nathan Shook into the faith and fellowship of the Glenview Community Church...Sharon and Kevin Count kicked off our Stewardship Campaign – A Living Church is a Giving Church - to financially support our many ministries in 2014... with their Sunday School teachers leading them, our children carried the spirit of worship with them from the Sanctuary to their Church School classes...Kristine Voelker helped us better understand our Faith In Action Team and the annual meeting of the Community Renewal Society (of which GCC is a member) at GCC on Saturday, October 5th...our Kindergarteners through Fourth Graders blessed us with decorated paper bags as we left worship so that we can help alleviate hunger by sharing our food with the Food Pantry at San Lucas UCC in Chicago...the Joyful Ringers rehearsed... and we ate, prayed and sang our dedication for the Peace Pole with GCC members and interfaith friends! Courtney will be our soloist and Ray will share the organ bench with Gary. Search Committee Chair Sally Thuresson, Pam Keckler, Elizabeth Hartung-Ciccolini, Dale Susan Edmonds, Chicago Metropolitan Association Minister Vertie Powers and Illinois Conference Minister Jorge Morales will participate. Douglas Anders, Conference Minister of the UCC's South Central Conference, as well as my seminary classmate and longtime friend, will offer a charge to the congregation. JOIN US ON OCTOBER 13TH TO CELEBRATE CHUCK'S INSTALLATION

Sunday, October 13, will mark a very special occasion as GCC celebrates the Installation of Rev. Dr. Charles E. Mize as our sixth Senior Pastor. While Dr. Mize and his wife, Jeanie Bond, have been with us since March 1, the second Sunday in October has been designated as the day to officially welcome Chuck as our new Senior Pastor.



Chuck and Jeanie's friends and former parishioners from Samuel UCC in Clayton, Missouri, and Union Congregational UCC in Green Bay have been invited and many of them are expected to attend. So it would be wonderful if GCC would turn out in large numbers to share in the fellowship and celebration.

Rev. Anthony Robinson, a UCC min-

ister from Seattle, will preach at the Installation Service, which is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. Rev. Robinson travels throughout North America as a speaker, teacher, preacher, consultant and coach serving congregations and their leaders. He is the author of several books, including **Changing the Conversation: a Third Way for Congregations**, which provides sage advice for mainline churches to remain vital, growing, "living" churches in the midst of an increasingly sectarian and fundamentalist religious environment. Rev. Robinson will also speak at the Sunday morning Adult Education seminar at 9:00 a.m. in the Chapel. He will be available after 10:00 a.m. worship for conversation and to sign copies of his book in the Mayflower Room.

In addition to congregants from the three large UCC churches Chuck has served, officials from the Chicago Metropolitan Association of the United Church of Christ, as well as Glenview area clergy, have been invited and will participate in the Installation Service. The GCC Chancel Choir, under the direction of Stephen Blackwelder, and accompanied by Minister of Music and Organist Gary Wendt, will offer special music for the occasion. Rev. Dr. Pam Keckler will also participate in the service.

Following the Installation Service, a reception will be held in the Mayflower Room, sponsored by the Senior Minister Search Committee. We hope that you can attend this very special event in the life of Glenview Community Church.

Khatami was a fair president but he could not inaugurate much reform and his international policies were undermined from inside and outside. What is in store for Rouhani? Does he have the chance and the will to overcome the formidable challenges that stymied Khatami? What are the chances of resolving the nuclear problem with the US and the EU countries? What are the prospects of new liberties in Iran not seen since President Ahmadinejad came to power eight years ago? These are some of the questions addressed in this lecture.

18TH ANNUAL PYF & CONFIRMATION CHRISTMAS TREE SALE


All trees are Fraser Firs - fresh cut less than one week prior to delivery and transported to Chicago via refrigerated trucks. The Fraser Fir has strong branches for decoration, beautiful dark green needles, full shape, wonderful aroma, and the ability to stay fresh the longest. Because of the size and fullness of the Fraser Fir, a substantial tree stand is needed. For those interested, Cinco tree stands are available at \$20.00 for the medium stand (holds up to a 8' tree), or \$25.00 for the large stand (up to 10'). These stands are durable, made of a material that will not crack or rust, easy to put the tree in and fill with water, and very economical.

Tree **pick-up** will be *Saturday, November 30, from 10:00 AM until 12:00 PM*. If you will be unavailable on this date, please arrange for your tree to be delivered or picked up by a friend. For *Glenview* residents wishing tree **delivery**, trees will be delivered by PYF on *Saturday, November 30*, for a fee of \$15.00. Please indicate address and any special instructions below.

The Christmas Tree Sale is one of PYF's most important fundraisers as 40% of each tree purchase goes directly to supporting PYF and Confirmation programs including scholarships for mission trips, and funding for GCC's mission outreach partners including Northfield Township Food Pantry and the Night Ministry.
