

### SEMPER REFORMANDA

We would not be celebrating the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation if it weren't for the irresistible dominance of Martin Luther's charismatic personality. Luther isn't the only great reformer of the 16th Century. There was Philip Melanchthon, and John Calvin, and John Knox, and Ulrich Zwingli, and Caspar Olevianus, and Zacharius Ursinus to name only a few. But just as we pin the beginning of the Civil Rights movement to December 1, 1955 when Rosa Parks refused to move to the back of the bus, and the beginning of World War II to December 7, 1941 when Japan attacked Pearl Harbor, we pin the beginning of the Protestant Reformation to October 31, 1517: the day that Luther posted his 95 Theses on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg. For the Protestant Reformation, Luther stands alone in power, in influence, in sensation, and in persuasion. He stands so squarely and is rooted so deeply in the great theological tradition of the Apostle Paul and St. Augustine that some consider him to be their equal in influence in Western Christianity. Whether he intended to or not, Luther sparked a movement that the princes of Germany rallied around and supported...a movement that emboldened them to defy the iron-fisted control of the church in Rome...a seismic shift that forever diminished the Roman church's spiritual and temporal power and sowed the seeds of commonwealth and democracy that blossomed into a renaissance of the human spirit.

Luther's personality is heroic; larger than life. At the Diet of Worms (his heresy trial) Luther defied Pope Leo X with a righteous flourish:

Here I stand. I can do no other. May God help me! Amen.

Martin Luther sparked a movement. But Philip Melanchthon turned it into an institution. Martin Luther was the shining star of the faculty in Wittenberg. His faculty colleague Philip Melanchthon was content to practice his scholarship in Luther's shadow. Luther was dynamic, bombastic, and eccentric; Melanchthon was reticent, circumspect, and reasoned. Most significantly, Philip Melanchthon took the sweeping inspiration of Luther's theological revolution and turned it into the systematic doctrine of the Augsburg Confession. In other words, Melanchthon institutionalized Martin Luther's movement. He turned Luther into Lutheran.

In the U.S. church we hardly know Philip Melanchthon's name. But, in Germany, Melanchthon stands co-equal with Luther: in sculpture, in portrait and in memorial in most churches, including in the Castle Church in Wittenberg where both are entombed in positions of equal honor near the altar (though Luther's tomb is beneath the pulpit!). This is the point: movements are energized by personalities. The Christian Church in the West stands on the backs of great personalities like St. Paul, St. Augustine, and Martin Luther. But movements don't survive unless they become institutions...unless they move on from the charismatic personality that inspired their beginnings.

By nature, movements are dynamic and revolutionary. They thrive on change. But institutions are static and traditional. They

venerate the status quo. The Glenview Community Church began as a movement. Its charismatic personality was the **Rev. Robert Edgar**, its founding pastor. During his nineteen years of ministry, GCC transitioned from movement to institution so successfully that it thrived in spite of the departures of Rev. Edgar and his three pastoral colleagues within the span of just a few months. That institution has carried us through more than 75 years.

Yet, for institutions to thrive they need to be re-energized and refreshed by movements that propel them out of their historic yesterdays and set them free from the deadly safety of we've never done it that way before! The church in general (and GCC in particular) cannot thrive if it doesn't become a movement again...a movement of the Holy Spirit...a movement of God's message, ministry and mission for today and tomorrow.

And that is the real significance of the Reformation. The heart of this 500th Anniversary of the Reformation is not in what happened in Wittenberg 500 years ago. It's in what happens in Glenview today and tomorrow. The rallying cry of the Reformation is the Latin phrase, Semper Reformanda. It means that what happened in Wittenberg on October 31, 1517 was the beginning of an ongoing reformation process. Because God is always reforming the church, the church must always be reforming. So, as we mark the Reformation's 500th Anniversary, our most important questions are: How is God reforming us? and How will we be the body of Christ in the world in irresistible, saving, transforming, and humanizing ways?

It all comes down to Jesus. Jesus is the core charismatic leader of our movement. He didn't found a church! Instead, He invites us to follow Him into a life of courage and compassion, of humility and truth, of justice and love. This is the movement to which we belong...the movement that never ends because its charismatic leader is still leading us on! In the words of the Easter proclamation: **Christ is risen! Christ is risen, indeed!** 

My prayer for the Glenview Community

Church is that we will experience the reforming movement of God's Spirit...that it will be a movement of faith that sets us free from fear...a movement of hope that sets us free from history...and a movement of surpassing love that sets us free for abundant life. When institution yields to movement, Reformation isn't memorialized history. It's a vibrant reality that propels us into God's own future. **Semper Reformanda!** See you in church!

### WHAT'S NEW? MINISTRY 101

There are many positive changes happening in leadership at GCC and it can be daunting to grasp the details and to figure out where each of us fits in. Here it is broken down.

There are 5 new leadership groups or ministries at GCC: Congregational Life, Faith Formation, Outreach, Resources, and Worship and Music. If you previously served on a "board," your "team" is now categorized within a ministry.

- 1) Let's start with Congregational Life. This ministry encompasses: Men's Ministry, Women's Associations, Membership Engagement, Fellowship, Congregational Care, Constructive Conversations, Health and Inclusivity.
- 2) Next is Faith Formation. This is comprised of Confirmation, Children's Programs, Youth, Adult Education and Spiritual Life.
- 3) Perhaps you are interested in helping others outside of GCC. This falls within the Outreach Ministry, including Faith in Action, Aid/Service and Invitation (Lectures, Open Houses, Visitor Follow-up, Member Recruitment and Church Promotion).
- 4) Logically, the Resource Ministry consists of Finance, Properties and Generosity (Stewardship).
- Finally, imagine life without worship and music ministry, incorporating worship support, hospitality, sanctuary support, music support, fine arts events and pageant.

Within each ministry there is a Steering Group consisting of a Chair, Vice Chair, and two Coordinators. Under each ministry, teams carry out functions that serve the congregation and the community. The Ministry Steering Groups are structuring their teams to meet current needs and enabling teams and ministries with common goals to work together for greater cooperation.

For volunteering, time commitments vary. Some teams, such as Communion, are ongoing. Others operate at specific times of year. You can volunteer for just the teams that interest you, without confining yourself to a single ministry. Teams are able to structure operations and meeting schedules in a way that works best for them, so joining a team does not always commit you to attending monthly meetings.

The goal of the new team structure is to allow members to lend their time and talents to the causes they care about the most. For instance, I can serve communion twice a year, help with a potluck dinner and participate in a service project – all with a total of less than an hour spent per month. Or I can volunteer more if I prefer.
