

OUR THESES

In this great celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, the primary – and nearly the only – personality we've focused on is Martin Luther. As the story goes, the defining moment in this watershed movement came when Luther nailed his 95 theses to the Castle Church door in Wittenberg. These theses are intellectual propositions that were meant for academic debate. They became incendiary when the established church heard them as challenges and threats to its authority.

If Martin Luther is the most famous personality of the Reformation, his 95 theses are the printed cornerstone of that revolution. Curiously, we've spent little to no time studying those theses, let alone committing even one of them to memory! That's understandable since they are 500 years old, and since they have no plot! Most of all, they're an historical document, not a contemporary, compelling manifesto. They're our heritage, not our heart.

One of the most revolutionary changes of the Reformation is that it made us all priests to one another. That means that the responsibility for mediating God's love and making it palpably available is no longer the exclusive property of the clergy. Now it's the common work of every Christian. So, on Reformation Sunday, I asked the Christians in our pews to write their own Reformation theses on red cards. This is the specific question that I asked:

How will you share God's love with others in one new way, beginning today?

The answers are inspiring, humbling, and deeply moving. Here are just a few:

I will show more patience with a difficult neighbor.

I will be more present and in the moment vs. thinking about next steps.

I will look my neighbor in the eye and say "Hello!"

I will perform a random act of kindness to a stranger every day.

I will share a new way to love my neighbor in everyday actions of kindness.

I will never underestimate what someone else is going through, and how a smile and kind word can make a small difference.

I will seek out those in need and help them physically, financially, socially, and politically.

I will forgive and move ahead. I will forgive and reach out to those who act against me. I will love the unloved and lonely.

I will reach out to someone who is hurting or hated and tell them that they are loved by God and by me.

I will be open to those who have very different opinions.

I will seek to listen more and understand more than I seek to be heard and understood.

I will pray for my neighbors on my street.

I will work to understand racism and white privilege.

I will not join in putting anyone down, even____.

I will help and love those I do not know and those I know but no longer love.

I will treat everyone with open, overt respect, one-on-one.

If you weren't in worship on October 29, don't breathe a premature sigh of relief because you're not off the hook! Take some time to write your Reformation theses right now...your commitment to begin sharing God's love with others in one new way, today.

GCC takes pride in being a congregational church. What we often mean by that is that every member gets a voice and a vote in decisions. But that's a partial and misshapen misunderstanding of what it means to be congregational. At its heart, congregational means exactly what Luther set forth 500 years ago. It means that we believe in the priesthood of all believers...that we are committed to being priests to one another...that the most central expression of our Christian faith is sharing God's love personally, specifically, and persuasively with others. If we aren't doing that as individual Christians, we are failing Christ. If we aren't doing that as a community of Christians, we are not Christ's living body. So hold on to the question:

How will you share God's love with others in one new way, beginning today?

Our answers are literally the difference between spiritual death and spiritual life! See you in church!

SPIRITUAL COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

OCTOBER 24, 2017

At its October meeting, the Spiritual Council received updates from the Construction Committee and Constitution Working Group, in addition to hearing from GCC's very active Ministries and pastors.

CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE

The Spiritual Council approved the wording for the motion to be put before the congregation at the November 5 Special Congregational Meeting. This vote will permit us to move to the next two phases of the building project—Design Development and Construction Documents. The congregation will hold another meeting in spring 2018 to vote on the final step of starting construction. The aim is to break ground on or around June 1, 2018.

CONSTITUTION WORKING GROUP

The CWG has begun meeting to discuss refinements to the Interim Constitution and Bylaws, to be approved by the congregation in May 2019. Please contact CWG chair Bob McGee (bmcgee(bmcgee750@gmail.com) with any comments you might have about the Constitution; feedback from all members of the congregation is welcome. The Spiritual Council will be working in conjunction with the CWG to develop a GCC Policy Handbook that will help guide Ministries and Teams as they work within the framework of the finalized Constitution.

MINISTRY REPORTS

All five Ministries continue to welcome volunteers for teams and team leadership. The Outreach Ministry is coordinating a churchwide service project at **Feed My Starving Children** on November 25. Look for sign-up information in the Bulletin and other church publications. The Women's Association has extended personal invitations to the female members of GCC and will continue to reach out to new members.

TREASURER'S REPORT

September pledge fulfillment was low, putting us behind budget for revenues by \$4,000 for the year to date. Our expenses are favorable to budget, but we are still in a deficit position and relying on reserve funds.

PASTORS' REPORTS




PYF MISSION TRIP 2018
