THE NEXT SEVENTY-FIVE

September 29 is the birthday of Glenview Community Church. On September 29, 1941, a bold new concept for Christian community became a reality in Glenview when the members of the Glenview Congregational Church voted to disband so that they could charter a new congregation that anchored its future in the call of Jesus to follow Him, and in the love of Christ that makes us all one. This would not be a denominational church; a local outlet for the doctrinal and organizational perspectives of a larger entity. Instead, it would transcend the limiting particularities of established denominations in order to bring Christians of many traditions together in community, in order to both share God's love in the Glenview community, and to support and enrich it.

It's been an amazing seventy-five years! With God's help and the passionate, and persistent evangelistic leadership of the Rev. Robert Edgar, this inspiration for a community church turned a Congregational congregation that fit in a little frame building on Dewes Street (a building that's now a house...and that's smaller than most of its neighbors!) into a church for the community with over three thousand members.

And the building grew just as fast! The first installment of our present edifice – the eastern part of the sanctuary as well as the wing that includes the present parlor and library – was built in 1946, just five years after the church was chartered and as soon as construction could begin after World War II. Thirteen years later in 1959, the last major addition of the chancel and transept was completed. Since then the only external addition to our building was the west entrance and elevator. In this frantic expansion, practical needs for more space made perfect functional planning a luxury that the church

couldn't afford.

Like Glenview, the growth of our congregation stabilized in the 1960's. The bold concept of a non-denominational community church was difficult to maintain without a network of support. So, in 1961, Glenview Community Church joined the United Church of Christ – the successor denomination to the Congregational Churches and the least denominational denomination in the United States! And, when the names of the two lower level parish halls were changed to the Mayflower Room and the Plymouth Room in the 1970s, the church slid back into the comfortable roots of its Congregational past.

In the fifty or so years between its membership peak in the 1960s and today, our congregation has shrunk. With a current membership of 1,300, Glenview Community Church is one of the largest congregations in the United Church of Christ. Yet our membership is only 40% of what it once was: a decline typical of that of mainline, established churches.

So, as we celebrate the events of the last seventy-five years, I pray that our focus will be even more on the promise of the next seventy-five years. On January 31, the congregation voted to take a daring step into that future by authorizing a Capital Campaign to raise as many funds as possible to repair, renovate and renew our church's building. From rotting windows and crumbling masonry to collapsing plumbing, electrical, communication and environmental systems, our building is in precarious shape and inches ever closer to catastrophic failure. Add to that a facility that is inaccessible (two of our elevators have been condemned; can you name them?)...a facility with inadequate and hard-to-find rest



rooms and no rest rooms on the sanctuary level...a facility that is worn and worn out by constant use, and the need is clear and critical.

I am so grateful for all the work that has been done by so many of you to bring us to this point: a useful life study of our facility to determine how much service is left in its several systems (and the answer is none!)... a collaborative planning process with The Kubala Washatko Architects that invited the congregation's input so that TKWA and Pepper Construction could produce a Master Plan to address the congregation's daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, annual and occasional needs for ministry that our building supports; and all of this essentially within the current footprint of our building...a lofty vision for fundraising and the choice of Havey and Associates to help make that vision real...and especially the congregation's faith that authorized a Capital Campaign to provide a future for our facility that is more than inadequate band-aids on systemic failures.

Yes, the vision is daunting. Yes, making it a reality will take a significant commitment from all of us. The cost for making just the central core functional, inviting and gracious is nearly \$8 million. But, the estimate for simply digging out the failing infrastructure, replacing it, and putting our building back in its current confusing and inaccessible state is \$4.5 million!

Thank you for deciding to try...for lifting your sights...for investing in the message, ministry and mission of God's love through Glenview Community Church for the next seventy-five years! If we do this, we are not doing it for ourselves! We are doing it for God and God's people whom we have yet to meet...just as our present building is our inheritance from people of faith we never knew. Most of all, we are doing this because we know and love Jesus, and because we are committed to sharing Jesus' great love. In the words of Dr. Purd Dietz's great hymn:

We would be building, temples still undone o'er crumbling walls, their crosses scarcely lift, waiting till love can raise the broken stone, and hearts creative bridge the human rift.
We would be building,
Architect Divine,
reveal the shape of life
in Your design.

Through February 7, 387 pledging units have committed \$950,959 to sustain and grow the Message, Ministries and Mission of Glenview Community Church in 2016. THANK YOU to everyone who has pledged!
