#### ABRAHAM'S GRANDCHILDREN



On Saturday morning, May 7, 150 people responded to an invitation from the Glenview Community Church to gather over breakfast, to meet new friends and to celebrate the beautiful diversity of God's people. The invitation was extended by our Faith in Action Team and our Fellowship Board to members of GCC and our neighboring Muslim communities. And what a response it was! Two of the leaders of our guest communities greeted me in tears because they were so deeply moved. Prayers were offered, stories were shared, and music was the language of unity that concluded the morning.

One of the most beautiful gifts of the morning was a painting of the Bosphorus. The Bosphorus is a narrow strait that joins Asian Turkey to European Turkey. The painting's inspiring symbolism is the friendship that binds our Christian community to the Muslim communities around us.

One of our guests celebrated this event by reminding us that we all belong to Grandfather Abraham: Jews, Christians and Muslims alike. Sarah, Hagar and Abraham are our common ancestors through Ishmael and Isaac. So we are one family, one blood. In a time when Muslims are targeted and scapegoated, it is a powerful witness to our common heritage and hope in this world.

The impetus for this event was the terror of the San Bernadino attacks last Decem-

ber. But the inspiration of this event is a possibility-filled beginning of deeper relationships and interfaith partnership in Glenview.

I don't want to overstate it, but I think this event is one of the most significant in GCC's 75 years. This is today's embodiment of the progressive, innovative spirit that brought GCC to birth. And it is a powerful and profound witness in a culture that is determined to diminish, demonize and even eliminate Muslims in our nation.

This event makes perfectly clear the crucial need for GCC's Christian presence and witness in Glenview. Last Saturday we made the love of God real and particular. Last Saturday we said YES to a Christian voice of welcome, inclusion and healing right here and right now. This is our purpose. This is our call.

And it's so important to remember that! Sometimes we get bogged down in little, niggling issues that consume our energy but make no significant difference in anyone's lives. Saturday's Unity Breakfast was just the opposite. It was a tremendous amount of work, but the energy and the inspiration that it generated far surpassed the investment.

Come hear a remarkable story, told with rarely seen documents from the GCC archives, and consider its consequences.







EUROPE AND ISLAM, FEARS AND

**REALITIES** Jim Kenney

Terror attacks in France, Turkey, and elsewhere have heightened European anxieties over Islam to the point where Euro-centric nationalism has become a dramatic concern in its own right. Islamophobia, as many Europeans and Americans are coming to realize, is usually linked to anti-Semitism, and is often protofascistic. It's a complex and alarming situation. We'll try to sort through the actual reasons for European fears and the somewhat less alarming realities of the modern interface of Islam and the West in Europe.





# JUNE 15 THE DIDACHE — THE TEACHING OF THE TWELVE APOSTLES Jerrrol Leitner

The Didache (Did-a-kay), a brief early Christian treatise, dates from the mid to late first century. Its importance is highlighted by the fact that some church fathers pushed to include it in the New Testament. Written perhaps even before the first gospel, the book's version of ritual and belief both agrees and clashes with that found in the New Testament – making for intriguing and enlightening study.
